RECTOR'S REFLECTIONS (Bob's Bit)

God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. *John* 3. 16

We are looking forward to the celebration of Easter, when we shall rejoice in the resurrection of Jesus with its promise for us of new life. How did this happen? It began with God's love for the whole world. God did not want people like us to spend eternity without him. But he had to deal with the problem of our sin, which separates us from him. His love for us made him send his one and only Son to pay the price of sin, by taking the place, which ought to have been ours, on the cross. This is God's gift to us.
